Note: Programs with certification lead to an Illinois teaching certificate for grades 6-12 in Social Science and History. An endorsement for teaching in middle-school (grades 6-8) requires two additional courses: CIE 484 and EPSY 446.

\* Of the 32 hours in history, students need a minimum of 6 hours in African, Asian, Latin American, and Middle Eastern history, 6 hours of European history and 12 hours of U.S. history.

\*\*Students need to apply for student teaching with their academic advisor one yr. in advance of the semester they expect to teach. Applications are available in the Council on Teacher Education, 3015 EPASW. Student Teaching is full time, off campus, & listed as two courses: Hist. 475 and 476; students must register for both. Hist. 475 & 476 must be passed with an "A" or "B" for certification credit.
